#### **DESCRIPTION:**

On Saturday morning, come celebrate the opening of the New Bay Bridge, which will open up to pedestrian traffic only (access ticket included). It is the single largest public infrastructure project in California's history. California has completed a 20-year effort to retrofit bridges throughout the state, and the opening of the New Bay Bridge is the final and largest project of all! Join thousands from all over the Bay Area and the entire state for this historic event ...Then later that evening, tickets (Plaza Club) are included to the A's game, along with a \$10 food coupon and post-game fireworks. Red Bull is hosting America's Cup in the Bay on Sunday morning. You control how engaged or independent you want to be with the rest of the group... join others for meals and cocktails and activities... explore and dine exclusively on your own... or partake in a combination of a little of both. The choice is yours. Whatever your travel style, leave yourself plenty of unplanned time – some of the best travel moments are those you stumble upon or spontaneously create.

#### **SNAPSHOT OVERVIEW OF OAKLAND:**

Although it is less than a dozen miles from San Francisco, Oakland is worlds apart from its sister city across the bay. After having suffered every mid-20th-century ailment, Oakland has slowly come back to life. Originally little more than a cluster of ranches and farms, it exploded in size and stature practically overnight when the last mile of transcontinental railroad track was laid down. Major shipping ports soon followed and, to this day, Oakland remains one of the busiest industrial ports on the West Coast.

Oakland was also once a hub of African-American culture on the West Coast. In the 1940s and '50s, Oakland was home to an entertainment corridor nicknamed The Harlem of the West. In the '60s, the city gave birth to the Black Panther Party. By the '80s, black folks made up nearly half of Oakland's population. Today, Oakland is one of the most diverse metropolitan areas in the U.S. — it's now 34 percent white, 28 percent black, 25 percent Latino and 17 percent Asian. However, some worry that diversity will dilute the city's black cultural identity. This phenomenon is affecting cities across the country. Atlanta, Washington, D.C., and Newark, N.J., have all seen their black populations decline.

Oakland has always been an important African American cultural center, with music, literature and art flowing through the city's tough veins. Oakland, with less than half of San Francisco's population, has more urban grit and moxie than its bigger nearby neighbor. These days, it is in the midst of a renaissance and its future continues to look brighter and brighter. Ten years ago, you would have never see what plays out these days – a trio of mustachioed white guys playing old-timey music smack in the middle of Telegraph Avenue on a Friday night while hordes of people out walk hand in hand, eating food truck grub and popping in and out of hip bars and art galleries.

Oakland also has a lovely old downtown, with many architectural gems surviving from the early 20th century, and a sweet little saltwater lake in the heart of town. It is a city of neighborhood waterfront joints, local groceries, small clusters of clubs, pubs, cafes, and restaurants, a few good museums, and home of a major league baseball team — all great reasons to visit the bay and spend a fog-free day exploring one of California's largest and most ethnically diverse cities.

There is also a little bit of time during the holiday weekend to take Bart from Oakland City Center to San Francisco for Union Square Union shopping, museums, Alcatraz Island (need tickets prior), Pier 39, Chinatown, or a night out on the town. Or stick closer to Oakland and Berkeley where there are also a bucket load of things to do, see, feel, touch and smell.

- PRICE: The tour price of \$295 pp (dbl occ) and based on a minimum of 30 participants (max 40). (\*) <u>Single, triple, and quad occupancy available please inquire!</u> The price is guaranteed, but if (due to unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of Teresa Beall Expeditions) our suppliers increase the costs, we will adjust the price accordingly. Should the number of participants be lower than the published minimum, the price will also be adjusted accordingly or the tour will be canceled.
- INCLUSIONS: Amtrak Bus/train ticket (R/T) between Chico and Oakland; hotel accommodations (dbl occupancy) including all taxes and daily breakfasts, and a ticket to the A's game with food voucher and post-game fireworks.
- EXCLUSIONS: Meals or beverages (other than daily breakfasts, as indicated), transfers between the train station and the hotel (0.8 miles can walk or hail a taxi) or throughout Oakland, ferry ticket to San Francisco, or personal expenditures of any kind.
